

Rural Municipality of Paynton #470

Bylaw No. 1 - 85

A bylaw of the Rural Municipality of Paynton #470, Saskatchewan, to designate the property known as the Alex Lennie House, in the Hamlet of Bresaylor, as being a site of architectural and historical value.

Whereas part 111 of The Heritage Property Act authorized the council of a municipality to enact bylaws to designate real property, including all building and structures thereon, to be architectural, historical or interest; and

Whereas the Council of the Rural Municipality of Paynton #470, has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as the Alex Lennie house, in the Hamlet of Bresaylor, Saskatchewan, a Notice on Intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such Notice of Intention to be published in at least two issues of a newspaper with general circulation in the municipality with the first publication at least 21 days prior to the date of the bylaw and with the last publication at least 7 days prior to the date of that consideration; and

Whereas no Notice of Objection of the proposed designation has been served on the clerk of the municipality;

Therefore, the Council of the Rural Municipality of Paynton No. 470 enacts as follows;

1. There is designated as being of architectural and historical value or interest, the real property known as the ALEX LENNIE HOUSE, in the Townsite of Bresaylor, described as;
